ABOVEGROUND STORAGE TANK PROGRAM

Resort Owners Guidance

- **Is your tank registered?** (for tanks over 110 gallons)
- **Does your tank have secondary containment** (a safeguard designed to keep spills or leaks of your stored product out of the ground or surface water)?
 - ✓ with walls that will contain 110 percent of the volume of the tank; and
 - ✓ with a sealed bottom under the tank area that will prevent leaks from faulty tank bottoms.

Common methods of secondary containment include:

- double-walled tanks;
- concrete (block walls are OK if they are sealed properly -- no cracks or holes; floor should be a slab and must meet walls with no gaps at the connections);
- sealed metal "boxes" or containers; or
- synthetic or thick plastic liner in an excavated area with pea rock or other fill material.
- If your tanks are registered and you have good secondary containment, you have satisfied the conditions of the permit requirement -- no fees or additional paperwork are required.
