The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) staff has reviewed the report titled "Annual Monitoring Report," dated January 23, 2006, prepared by Coteau Environmental. The MPCA staff agrees with your consultant recommendations as discussed in Section 3, pages 4 and 5 of the above report, with the following modifications:

- Vapor screening of the residence at 110 South Western Avenue using a photoionization detector (PID) is not necessary. The recommended use of Summa canisters on a quarterly basis is sufficient.

If subsequently obtained information indicates that the agreed upon recommendations are inappropriate or inadequate, the MPCA may require additional work or modifications in the approved work.

The MPCA staff request that sampling begin within 60 days of receipt of this letter and that the work be completed by August 1, 2007. Failure to meet this deadline in a timely manner may result in reductions in Petrofund reimbursement or lead to MPCA enforcement actions.
