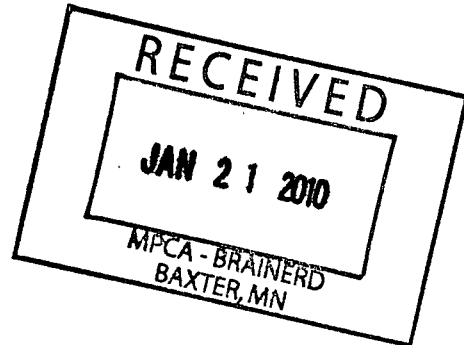

**Re: Monitoring Well and Vapor Point Sealing Summary, Former KC's  
Quick Stop, 230 1<sup>st</sup> Street, Brooten, Minnesota, MPCA

Glacial Lakes Environmental Consulting, Inc. (GLEC) oversaw the sealing of six ground water monitoring wells (MW-1 through MW-6) and two permanent vapor monitoring points (Basement Sub-slab and Permanent Port East of 110 Southwest Avenue Residence) on October 26, 2009. The monitoring wells and vapor monitoring points were associated with a petroleum release investigation conducted at the referenced facility. Glacial Ridge Drilling, Inc. of New London, Minnesota completed the sealing operations and subsequently submitted Well and Boring Sealing Records to the Minnesota Department of Health for the six monitoring wells.

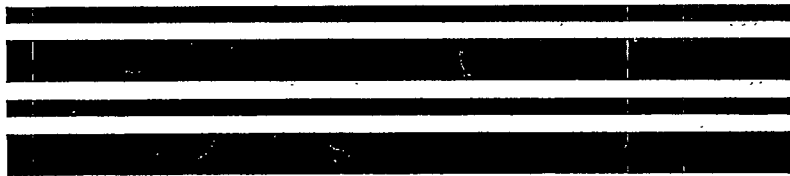
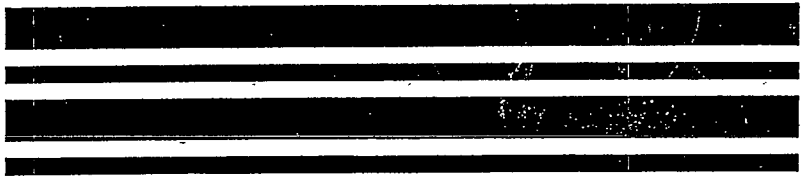
Of note, a third permanent vapor sampling location was present at the residence located at 110 Southwest Avenue. However, the sampling location consisted of a crawl space beneath the main floor and the sampling access point was simply a hole through the floor in a bedroom on the main floor of the house. There was no sub-grade apparatus in need of sealing associated with this sampling location. Please call me at 320-905-5846 with any questions.
