On April 24, 2009, the MPCA Petroleum Brownfield Program (PBP) approved response action plan for managing petroleum impacted soils and/or ground water during construction for a grain storage bin at the above referenced site. This was in addition to soil being managed for the open leake site. We also sent a letter on May 20, 2012 asking for a status report regarding the development. As of today's date we have not received any information regarding the development status. Please provide a status regarding the proposed development within 10 days. If a response is not received within 10 days, the PBP program will cancel the Brownfield request, and any previous actions related to this will no longer be valid.
