Marlin,

I just received a clarification that the material from South Central Grain is not contaminated grains as I originally thought but rather it is excavated contaminated (Nitrogen and petroleum) soil. Now that we know what we are dealing with, my recommendation is to follow what is in your Industrial Solid Waste Management Plan for the acceptance of petroleum contaminated soil. I would also strongly recommend that the material be placed within the lined area (no stockpile outside the lined area) if accepted. Because of the nitrogen and the petroleum products in the material, any and all moisture in contact with the material should remain or contained within the lined area. If used as cover material, you need to make sure that runoff from the cover is managed appropriately. Also, storage of the material on the liner is limited to six months from the date the material is delivered to you facility. Please let me know if you have any questions or comments.
