Stacey,

Following July 2009 soil correction activities associated with the approved DRAP at the South Central Grain & Energy site in Hector (LEAK #17141), Glacial Lakes Environmental Consulting (GLEC) began to look for disposal options for the contaminated soil stockpile (180 cubic yards). GLEC first looked at land farming the contaminated soil. However, after repeated attempts to contact the nearest land farmer in Cottonwood GLEC had to look at other means for the soil disposal. The next most cost effective means for disposal of the contaminated soil was the Renville County Landfill for use as daily cover. GLEC contacted the landfill and provided them with the analytical results of the soil stockpile samples. Upon review of the lab results, Renville County Engineer Marlin Larson indicated that Renville County would accept the contaminated soil for use as daily cover.

GLEC is proposing to dispose of the 180 cubic yards of petroleum-contaminated soil at the Renville County Landfill for use as daily cover. Upon approval, GLEC will begin the scheduling of the hauling to the landfill. Scale tickets will be kept for each truckload and will be provided in the corrective action report.
